1978

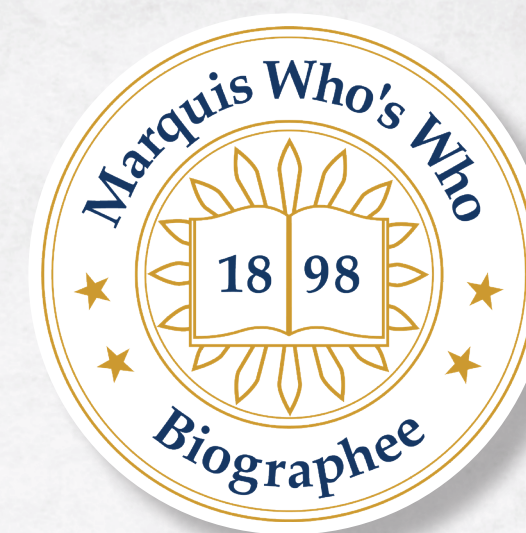
Dr. Brown is promoted to assistant professor at Oklahoma State University.
